
Who we are and what we believe

The Union of Canadian Transportation Employees is a labour union that represents firefighters, airport staff, ships' crews, technicians who work alongside scientists, investigators, policy analysts, administrative personnel, and other working-class Canadians. As a labour union, we advocate on behalf of workers for fair wages, better working conditions and safe workplaces.

The labour movement has always been on the forefront of equality rights. At a time when women often felt that they either had to quit their jobs or continue to fend off unwanted advances, we were advancing the conversation about sexual harassment in the workplace. We also fought and continue to fight the gender pay gap. During the 90s, public-sector labour unions went on strike over the issue of maternity leave; these hard-fought battles paved the way for the parental leave all Canadians enjoy today. Years before marriage equality became law, we fought for same-sex partners to have access to the same benefits as opposite-sex partners. And right now, we're working hard to create safer and more inclusive workplaces for our trans, non-binary and two-spirit friends.

As labour activists, we will continue to advocate for the broader working class and equity-seeking groups. It's our belief that everyone deserves to be treated with respect, dignity and fairness, in the workplace and beyond.

Who can apply

The scholarship is open to the following students who are finishing high school and entering their first year of university, college or another institute of higher learning on a full-time basis:

- Children and grandchildren as well as dependent children and grandchildren of UCTE members in good standing, retired members and deceased members.
- Children and dependent children of UCTE national office staff.

Requirements

To qualify, you must also meet the following requirements:

- A standing of 70% or higher in subjects required for entrance to university, college or a recognized institute of higher learning.
- Proof of registration in a full-time program at university, college or a recognized institute of higher learning.
- An essay between 1,000 and 1,500 words on the following topic: What I foresee as the role of organized labour in the future.

Application checklist

Please make sure that all the following documents are included with your application, otherwise, it may be considered incomplete.

- A completed application form (page 7)
- A statement about your post-secondary program and future career plans (page 11)
- A short statement from a teacher (page 12)

Documents to attach

- An essay between 1,000 and 1,500 words (see requirements on this page)
- Proof of registration in a full-time program at a post-secondary institution
- A full copy of your secondary school transcript, including the final record for the past year;

If applying based on financial need:

- Statement of parent's income (page 8, only if the application is for financial reasons).
